In this study we will ask questions about your interactions with family and friends, relationships with others, expectations, and achievements. You may choose not to answer any question for any reason. Your parent/caregiver said that you can participate, but you can still say no if you don't want to. You may leave the study at any time. If you leave the study before it is finished, there will be no penalty to you.

We believe there are very few risks involved in participating in this study. We follow stringent practices to maintain the security of all data that could identify you, so we believe the risks to your privacy are very small. Your answers to the questions will be kept confidential.

(For Interviewer: Face to Face Interview) We will conduct the interview in a private setting of your choice. / (For Interviewer: Telephone Interview) We will conduct the interview at a time when you can speak to us in private. Your answers will be used for research only and will be stored in secure data repositories for future research studies. If we share your information with other researchers it will be de-identified, which means that it will not contain your name or other information that can directly identify you. Such future research studies may be similar to this study or completely different. We will not ask for your additional informed consent for these future studies. There is no limit on the length of time we will store your information.

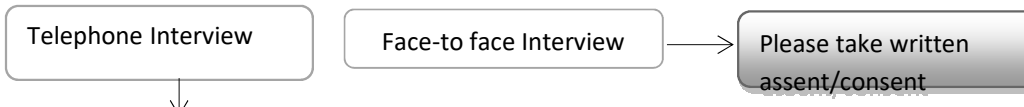

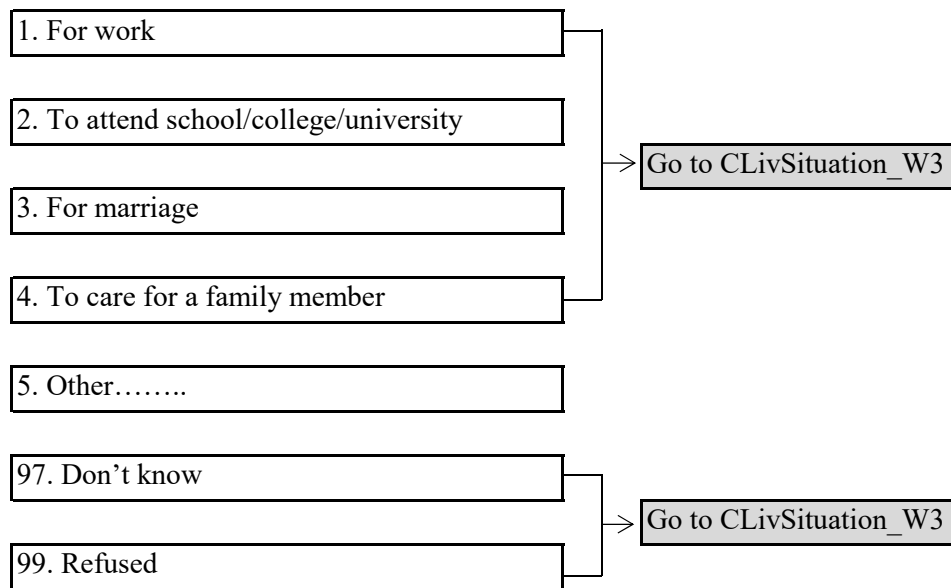

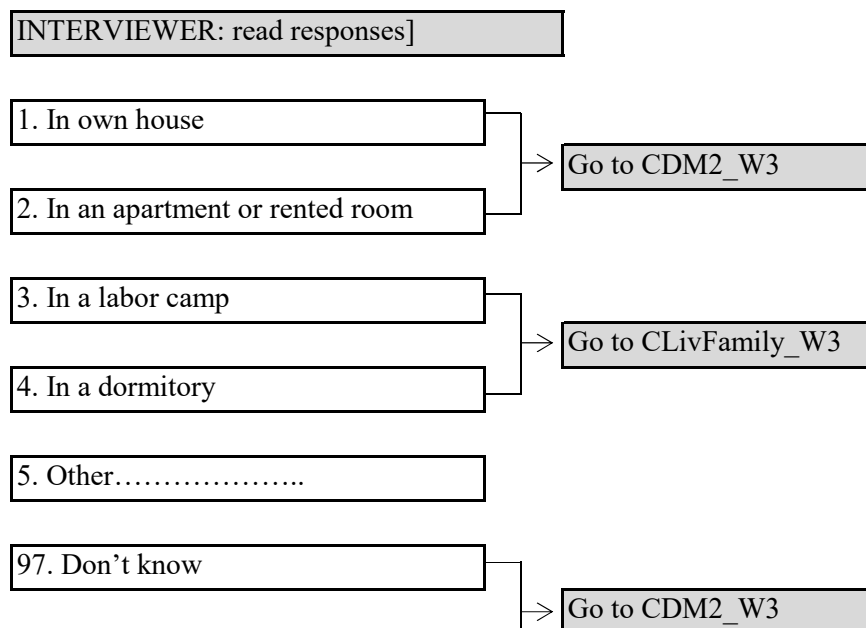
